

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Respite Care Services program provides an opportunity for the family to acquire relief time up to 48 hours a month.

This benefits and creates growth opportunities of companionship for both the volunteer and the child with special needs.

WHO QUALIFIES TO RECEIVE SERVICES?

Any family that has one or more children with special needs between the ages of 0 and 18 years, who has been diagnosed with a disability that affects their cognitive development. (i.e.: ADHD, Autism, Down Syndrome, FASD, etc.)

Volunteers receive a monthly allowance to cover activities



TO QUALIFY, VOLUNTEERS MUST BE:

- 18 years of age or older
